NEW BOARD MEMBER APPOINTED TO VEOHRC

Mr Finnis was previously the Chair of Ladder, a football players' charitable initiative tackling youth homelessness. He was also a founding director of HeartKids Australia, a charity supporting children with congenital heart disease.

Before working in the AFL, Mr Finnis was a commercial lawyer, advising numerous sporting organisations, businesses, sportspeople and government.
